The day also gave our students a chance to meet and talk to undergraduate students and listen to a panel of UCL Alumni, ranging from those working for the BBC, Deliveroo and the Government Economics Service. Our students asked questions to the panel including whether they recommend completing a joint honours degree. The day ended with a walk around the UCL Bloomsbury campus, learning about the history of economics around UCL and important figures such as John Maynard Keynes.


