Our school has already undergone works to ensure we can accommodate a huge range of students who may have varying needs in relation to accessibility. However, our diligent and inclusive student council have undertaken an audit of the academy in order to draw up an action plan with the support of people with a range of disabilities. The plan will form the basis of our next steps in ensuring we can meet all accessibility needs.
