On Friday, the students were split into three groups covering areas such as networking, CVs and interview skills. Delivered with role play and visual resources, the day was both informative and fast moving.

KPMG also informed the students about their KPMG360 degrees and School Leavers programme. Both provide paid work experience and qualifications across all the sectors they provide a service for.

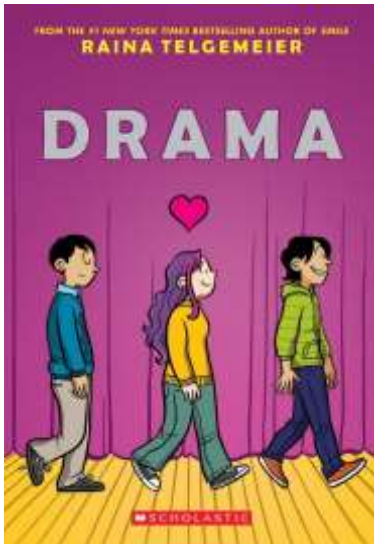

## Drop Day

Year 7 all took part in a STEM project where they had to build a rocket. This involved the students learning about resources on different planets, and then planning and budgeting a one way trip to their chosen planet. They had to decide how many people to take and what items were vital to their planet. Nandos seemed to be very popular and an essential part of planet life!

The students were all given a rocket building kit of house hold items, such as tape, card, string and stickers and asked to design and build a model rocket- the students were really inventive and used great imagination. The students then launched their rockets from the air powered launchers. They then used their engineering skills to test, improve and re test.



The finale in the sports hall was a great success, which saw Taurean Cadman winning the competition which saw his rocket travel the entire length of the Sports Hall! Well done Taurean!

Year 8 focused on exploring future careers and aspirations which included every student creating their own personalised profile on 'start' followed by some really exciting and engaging employer encounters. Some feedback from our Y8 students follow;

"We met graduates in Technology and Engineering from Inmarsat. We learnt that you can make a wifi signal anywhere in the world by contacting a satellite in space using a 'terminal'. Going outside and testing the terminal in the playground was exciting. They also talked about the importance of perseverance and not giving up. Having more than one goal to pursue at a time, following your interests and believing in yourself. We also learnt about Cybersecurity and how technology companies help protect you from hackers."

"We met the Director of Corporate Banking at RBS. She talked about how our school activities help to develop up for the future- after school clubs are good because they help you decide what your interests are which can inform your future career. We did a SWOT analysis task. This a way you can break a problem down into strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. Then you can pick out key information to prioritise first."

Year 8 also met with the London Fire Brigade and learnt about the importance of fire safety in the home and what the fire brigade can do to help their families.

Year 9 students spent the day doing a variety of activities. By the end of the day Year 9 students had all done an hours First Aid training with St Johns Ambulance. They also focused on exploring possible career paths which will enable them to start having meaningful conversations about the kind of work experience placement they would like to explore next year. Year 9 also had workshops exploring peer pressure which involved healthy discussion and debate around quite challenging content. In addition they looked at global warming as a topic and some effects that global warming and climate change are having on our planet. There was much discussion around what students could do.
