Safeguarding Knowledge

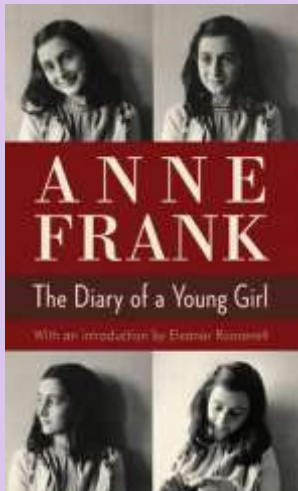


- What social media Apps do parents need to be aware of?

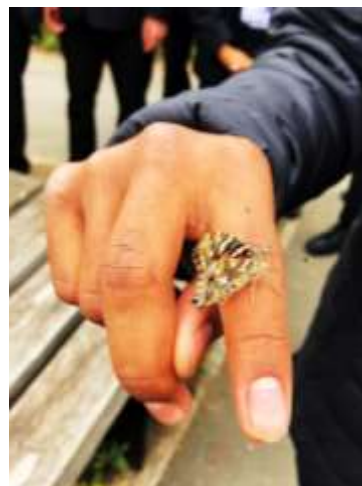

On Thursday 20th June they visited the old town of Ascoli Piceno, a small town rich in monuments and precious palaces in Romanic and Baroque styles. They baked cakes and hosted an afternoon tea party for the local people in the village.

On the last day, they went out for dinner and had ice cream in the square in Sorrano. The students all said it was the best trip that they had ever been on and that they would never forget it.
