Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

**As I was going to St. Ives,

Kits, cats, sacks, wives – how many were going to St. Ives?

Answer

A trick question. Since you met the man on the way to St. Ives, he and his entourage must be coming *from* St. Ives. So the answer is just one – you. If you're feeling evil you might want to conspicuously distribute calculators for this puzzle.

If you do actually go through the calculations you should get $7 + 7^2 + 7^3 + 7^4 = 7 + 49 + 343 + 2401 = 2800$. This problem is very old indeed. It is supposed to date back to the ancient Egyptians:

Christmas jumpers or House colours are not compulsory but for the price of a bottle of drink you can help make a huge difference to somebody's life!


