### **Maths stars**



conclusions about the role of education, (20) Manists hold a critical view of the education system, arguing that the education system is a form of social control which creates an obedient and passive workforce for the capitalist society. They also explain that the system produces inequalities since in maintains the interests of the upper class, leaving students from a poorer background at a disadvantage in the world of work. 



### MATHS PROBLEMOF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

What is the smallest number of additional squares that must be shaded so that this figure has at least one line of symmetry and rotational symmetry of order 2?




#### Solution

The shape must have rotational symmetry of order 2, so when it is rotated through 180°, the squares that the shaded squares rotate to must also be shaded.

These are marked in red on the diagram.

This pattern has two lines of symmetry, along the diagonals of the square, so it satisfies both criteria.

Therefore the minimum number of extra squares that need to be shaded is 3.
