The **Wellcome Collection** has a season of free events, activities and exhibitions celebrate the complexity of Joy, Happiness and Tranquillity.

Visit the **Tate Modern** where artist Anicka Yi's robo-army, a squadron of alien machines, are floating in the Turbine Hall.

Explore the city's **hidden gardens** such as Postman's Park, with its 'Everyday Hero' ceramic plaques, Bow Creek Ecology Park or St Dunstan-in-the-East, a ruined medieval church that's almost smothered by nature.

**MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK**

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

The diagram shows nine points in a square array.

What is the smallest number of points that need to be removed in order that no three of the remaining points are in a straight line?

**Solution**

At least one point must be removed from each of the three horizontal lines; so at least three points need to be removed.

Removing the three points lying on either diagonal does what is required.
