MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

The table shows the distance (in km) between five towns in southern France.
Five friends live in these five towns and want to meet.
In which of these towns should they meet to keep the total travelling distance as small as possible?

Solution

If the friends meet in **Bergerac**, the total distance travelled will be 87 + 79 + 61 + 58 kms = 285 kms

Bergerac	Bordeaux	Langon	Libourne	Marmande
87	79	61	58	

If the friends meet in **Bordeaux**, the total distance travelled will be 87 + 47 + 31 + 84 kms = 249 kms

Bergerac	Bordeaux	Langon	Libourne	Marmande
87	47	31	54	65

If the friends meet in **Langon**, the total distance travelled will be 79 + 47 + 54 + 37 kms = 217 kms

Bergerac	Bordeaux	Langon	Libourne	Marmande
79	47	54	37	65

If the friends meet in **Libourne**, the total distance travelled will be 61 + 31 + 54 + 65 kms = 211 kms

Bergerac	Bordeaux	Langon	Libourne	Marmande
61	31	54	65	84

If the friends meet in **Marmande**, the total distance travelled will be 58 + 84 + 37 + 65 kms = 244 kms

Bergerac	Bordeaux	Langon	Libourne	Marmande
58	84	37	65	65

So the friends should meet in Libourne.

Art therapist

Art therapists help people express difficult thoughts and feelings through creative activities.

£30,401 - £43,772 a year Working 37-39 hours per week, sometimes freelance/self-employed

You'll need to complete a postgraduate qualification approved by the Health and Care Professions Council. You should have a degree in art or creative therapies to do a postgraduate course. You may be able to apply if you've got a degree in a related subject, for example psychology, nursing or social work.

You may be able to do an arts therapist degree apprenticeship. You'll usually need a qualification and experience in art, drama or music to apply.
