
# Theatre company perform Macbeth

### MATHS PROBLEMOF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

The kettle in Keith's kitchen is 80% full. After 20% of the water in it has been poured out, there are 1152ml of water left.

What volume of water does Keith's kitchen kettle hold when it is full?

#### ANSWER: 1800ml

20% of the 80% is 16% of the kettle's capacity. Therefore the volume of water left in the kettle after Keith has poured out 20% of the original amount is 64% of the kettle's capacity. So when full, the kettle holds  $\frac{1152}{6}$ × 100 ml, that is 1800 ml.
