GREENPOWER - the race is on

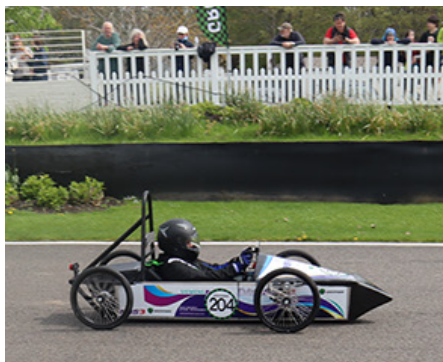
On Sunday 30th May our young racing drivers took part in the first Greenpower heat of the season at the iconic Goodwood race circuit.

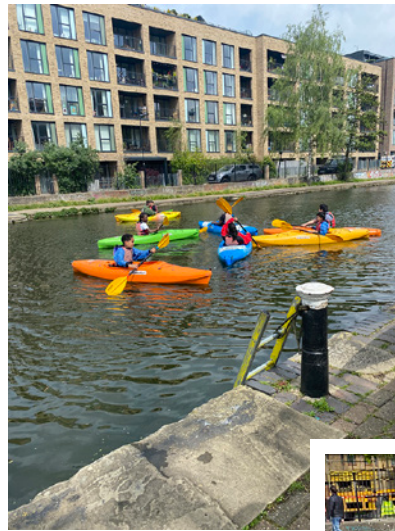

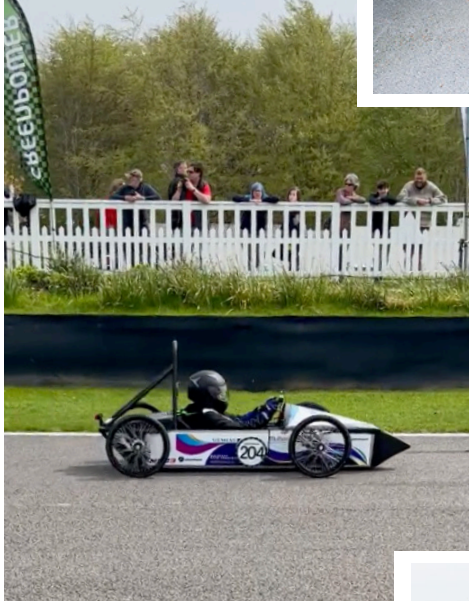


GREENPOWER The race is on...

MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

Harriet has a square piece of paper. She folds it in half to form a rectangle and then in half again to form a second rectangle (which is not a square). The perimeter of the second rectangle is 30 cm.

What is the area of the original square?

SOLUTION: 144cm²

Let the side-length of Harriet's square be $4x$ cm. Then, the rectangle obtained when the square is folded in half measures $4x$ cm by $2x$ cm.

When that rectangle is folded in half, it gives a rectangle which is not a square so this rectangle measures $4x$ cm by x cm. The perimeter of the smaller rectangle is $2(4x + x)$ cm = $10x$ cm.

Therefore, since the perimeter of the smaller rectangle is given as 30 cm, we have $x = 3$.

Hence the side-length of Harriet's square is 12 cm and its area is 144 cm².
