Societies Trip to Portsmouth

On Tuesday the Social Sciences and History societies went on a trip to the naval base in Portsmouth to visit the Royal Navy's HMS Queen Elizabeth warship. Students learned that the impressive 280 metre ship is capable of carrying 40 aircraft on it's enormous 4 acre flight deck and when the ship is deployed there are 1600 personnel on board. They also learned that there are a lot of different roles on board the ship such

as those delivering airpower, air traffic control, hospitality, aircraft operations, communications, maintenance, patrolling, diplomatic receptions and humanitarian assistance. The company
