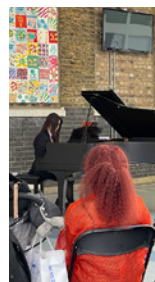
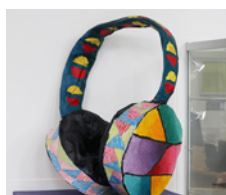
# Boat trip at Fairlop Waters

They subsequently had the opportunity to ask questions of two members of Rushanara Ali MP's team

and develop their understanding of day-to-day life for an MP and their staff. Overall it was a fascinating and lively trip that greatly enriched their study of the UK's political system.
