On Tuesday Year 11GCSE Geography students went on a GCSE urban fieldwork trip to Canary Wharf/ Mudchute as part of the 3rd component of GCSE geography.

The purpose of the trip was to investigate the question 'What will be the differnces between the CBD and Inner City in East London?' They did this by focusing on Environmental quality, Land use and Regeneration.

To investigate this question the students used a range of different qualititative and quantitative research methods such as Environmental Quality Surveys, Retail Surverys, Field sketches and pedestrain counts.

What is the maximum number of diagonals that can be drawn in these unit squares so that no two diagonals share a common point (including endpoints)?




ANSWER: 10
