Personal Statement Tuition: Our Top Scholars all received an hour of tuition to support them in writing their personal statements over half term. The tutors were very impressed both with our students participation and statements. Students will be

sending off their applications in November to a number of Russell Group unis to study a huge range of subjects, including mechanical engineering, art, acting, computer science, economics, PPE, law, finance, biomed and nursing!

As of 8th November we have 196 UCAS applications started and 13 students have already applied. Of the students who have applied, 92% have already received offers to a number of Russell group universities, including Durham, Liverpool, Cardiff, Queen Mary, Newcastle and York, to study mechanical engineering, maths, English lit. law. biomed and computer science.

As soon as pupils entered the auditorium, they were bombarded by an array of colours, upbeat music and red 'Debate Mate' balloons jumping from one blur of school uniforms to another. Motivational videos with famous faces adorned the massive screen at the front, while pupils screamed and squealed with excitement every time one of their favourite celebrities came on the screen. After an introduction by James Waterfield, Director of Programmes at Debate Mate, there was a show debate in which our own Melissa Kibrom (Year 9) assisted James with the timekeeping. The motion for the debate was 'this House believes that rap music by artists such as Stormzy and Central Cee should be taught in English lessons instead of writers like Shakespeare'; while both the opposition and proposition fought

hard, it was clear from the beginning that the proposition had won the audience's vote – this was reaffirmed when we decided the winner by cheer and applause at the end of the debate. 


## House Rewards





## STEM CORNER

#### JP Morgan Schools Challenge

This week, two teams of Y9 students participating in The Schools Challenge met their professional mentors from J.P. Morgan, the world's largest bank. The teams competed against each other in a number of team-building activities and got to know their mentors.

Over the next few months, they will be working together to come up with a solution to poor air quality, limited water sources, or how to produce and use food more responsibly in school. They will build a 3D prototype, brand, logo and business to support their ideas.











### MATHS PROBLEMOF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

I choose four different integers. When I add all the pairs of these numbers in turn, the totals that I obtain are 23, 26, 29, 32 and 35, with one of these totals being repeated.

What is the largest of the four integers?

#### **SOLUTION:**

Let the four different integers, in ascending order, be p,q,r,s. Then p < q < r < s. So p+q < p+r < p+s < q+s < r+s and p+q < p+r < q+r < q+s < r+s. Each of these strings of inequalities gives five different values for sums of pairs. So each is the string of five values given in the question: namely 23 < 26 < 29 < 32 < 35. Hence it may be deduced that p+q=23; p+r=26; p+s=q+r=29; q+s=32; r+s=35. Therefore s-r=(p+s)-(p+r)=29-26=3. So (r+s)+(s-r)=35+3=38. Hence 2s=38 and the largest of the four integers is 19.

(It is left as an exercise for the reader to calculate the values of the other three integers and to check that, when added in pairs, the four integers give the sums stated in the question.)
