Year 7 Climbing

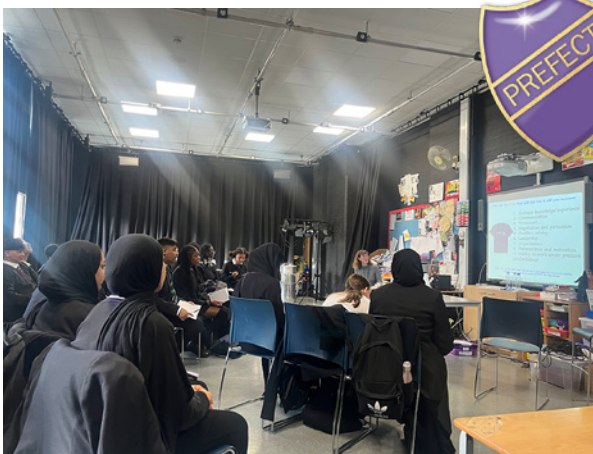
