MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

Susan is attending a talk at her son's school. There are 8 rows of 10 chairs where 54 parents are sitting.

Susan notices that every parent is either sitting on their own or next to just one other person.

What is the largest possible number of adjacent empty chairs in a single row at that talk?

ANSWER: 4 chairs

For the number of adjacent empty chairs in a single row to be a maximum, all rows apart from that one must hold as many parents as possible.

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In view of Susan's observation, the maximum number of parents sitting in any row is seven, as the upper diagram shows. Therefore, the maximum number of parents in seven of the eight rows is $7 \times 7 = 49$. The number in the remaining row is then $54 - 49 = 5$. In that case, and again in view of Susan's observation, the maximum number of adjacent empty chairs would be four as shown in the lower diagram.
