From September 2019, the HPV vaccine is being offered to boys as well as girls. The HPV vaccine is universally offered as routine in year 8. The vaccination is free and recommended for young people to protect them against the human papilloma virus which increases the risk of developing some cancers later in life, such as cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers and some cancers of the anus and genital areas. 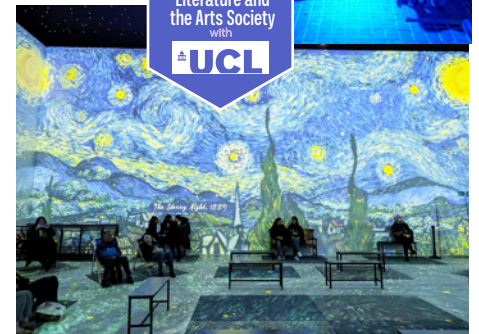

Computer Science

Our Y13 A Level Computer Science students are making good progress on their projects! For the course, they analyse, design, develop, test and evaluate a project of their choosing. Most of our students have opted to use the Python pygame library to create 2D games. Some examples below include: a pac-man style game, using Dijkstra's algorithm to find the shortest path to the player (Nabil Ahmed) a cross between Tetris and Fireboy and Watergirls where Spiderman must reach the end goal (Amina Begum) a racing game using the laws of physics to have accurate car acceleration and deceleration (Mas'ud Sharif)
