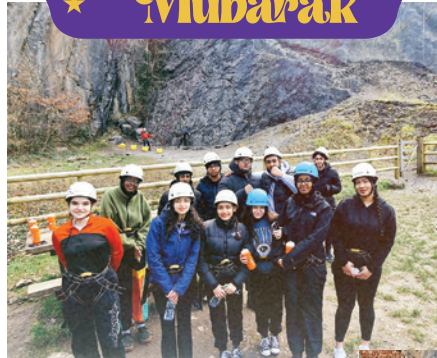


## Executive Principal's and Head of School's News

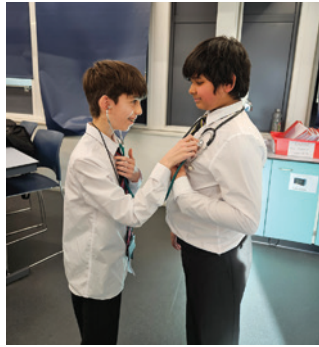
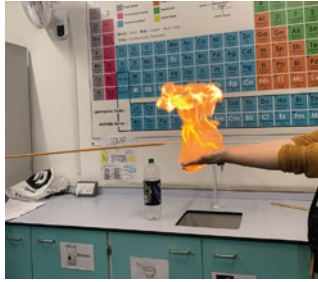

## Brick Lane Books

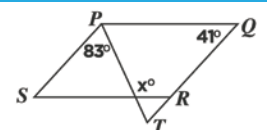

## MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

In the diagram the lines PQ and SR are parallel, as are the lines PS and QT. What is the value of  $x$ ?



**ANSWER:  $124^\circ$**

Angle  $PSR = 41^\circ$  (opposite angles of a parallelogram are equal). Therefore  $x = 41 + 83$  because the exterior angle of a triangle is equal to the sum of the two interior opposite angles.
