


























Year 10 trip to see National Theatre's Jekyll and Hyde

Coney x Greenpeace project

On Wednesday 17th of January a small group of Year 9 students started a twelve-week-long project with social change charity Coney and Greenpeace.

We started the project by playing Extraction Economy Game to better understand the power structures of the global economy. Each session would begin with a code from Magic Phone number, solving series of puzzles and completing the tasks with the help from Kai- the online platform.

During a series of team building activities we came up with the code name FRUFFLES (because every team member likes fruit on waffles) and then the real work began...

As a team, we focused on plastic pollution, inspired by activists Melati and Isabel Wijsen. Of course, we had to start small and somewhere familiar to us- Mulberry Academy Shoreditch. We realised that the recycling system in our school could be better and that became our ask.

We chose Mrs Holden as the recipient of our gift in hopes of starting a dialogue about the waste management.

With support from activist and artist Toby Peach and Ms Kilmanaite, students made a Pandora's box filled with facts about the plastic pollution. Inside it we put a little treasure chest with a special gift for Mrs Holden and a USB containing PowerPoint presentation explaining who we are and why we made this gift.

On Friday 22nd of March, we had the opportunity to deliver our gift in person and Mrs Holden invited us to a catch-up meeting for a further discussion.

MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

In Niatirb they use Cibara numerals. These are the same shape as normal Arabic numerals, but with the meanings in the opposite order. So "O" means "nine", "1" means "eight" and so on. But they write their numbers from left to right and use arithmetic symbols just as we do. So for example, they use 62 for the number we write as 37.

How do the inhabitants of Niatirb write the answer to the sum which they write as (837+742)?

ANSWER: 580

The sum is what we would write as 162 + 257 and this equals 419. However, in Niatirb it would be written 580.
