your specialist topic on the reply slip to put yourself in for a chance to win the title of Mulberry Academy Shoreditch Mastermind 2025!




SCIENCE WEEK

Year 7 students recently engaged in a hands-on activity where they constructed catapults using lollipop sticks and elastic bands. This fun project not only allowed them to get creative but also helped them explore the concept of elastic potential energy. As they pulled back their catapults, they observed how the stored energy in the elastic bands was released to launch projectiles, providing a practical understanding of physics in action.









MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

The Pythagoras Patisseries sells triangular cakes at 39p each and square buns at 23p each. For her party, Helen spent exactly £5.12 on an assortment of these cakes and buns.

How many items in total did she buy?

ANSWER: 16 items

One cake and one bun cost a total of 62p. Note that $512 \div 62 = 8$ remainder 16 and note also that 16 = 39 - 23. Hence $512 = 8(39 + 23) + 16 = 8(39 + 23) + 39 - 23 = 9 \times 39 + 7 \times 23$. As 39 and 23 do not have a common factor, other than 1, Helen must have bought 9 cakes and 7 buns.

BAFTA Skills workshop

During National Careers Week, we took 30 year 12 students to a Career Insight Day at the BAFTAs, delving into transferable skills and industry pathways. From witnessing Alex Mechanikool Peters' performance to exploring game design with ustwo games, the day brimmed with inspiration.
