TRAILFAM

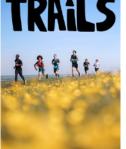

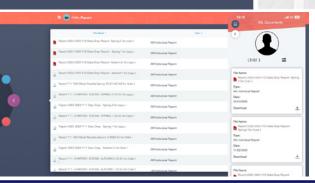
