## Year 7 STEM Girls Visit Form with Jaguar TCS Racing

At the end of last term, a group of our Year 7 (now Year 8) STEM girls enjoyed an unforgettable trip to the Formula E practice session at London's ExCeL Centre, hosted by Jaguar TCS Racing.

The day gave students the chance to step behind the scenes of a world-class motorsport team and see how science, technology, engineering and maths are used in real life. From exploring the Jaguar TCS Racing garage to learning how engineers and data scientists prepare the cars for the track, the girls were immersed in the excitement of Formula E.

One student said: "I never realised how much technology goes into an electric race car - it made me want to learn more about engineering."

The group also met female engineers and team members, who shared their career journeys and offered advice about pursuing STEM. This had a big





impact on the girls. "It was really inspiring to meet women who are working in jobs like engineering and technology. It made me feel like I could do it too," commented another Year 7 student.

The highlight of the visit was watching the cars on track during the live practice session. "The cars were so fast, and the atmosphere was amazing





- I'll never forget it," said one of the girls afterwards.

Our Year 7 STEM group returned full of excitement and motivation to explore the opportunities that STEM subjects can open up. A huge thank you to Jaguar TCS Racing and TCS for giving our students this incredible experience and for helping us inspire the next generation of young women in STEM.









### **International Literacy Day**

## Every Day Counts Don't Miss Out!

At Mulberry Academy Shoreditch, we know that excellent attendance is one of the key foundations for success. Every school day matters, and students who attend regularly not only achieve better academically but also build stronger friendships, develop good routines, and feel more confident in their learning.

#### Consider the impact:

At 95% attendance, a student misses 10 days across the year , equivalent to 2 weeks of learning. At 90% attendance, a student misses 20 days, that is 4 weeks of learning lost!
