Messages, images, or videos can be screenshotted and shared beyond the group; sending explicit content can even be illegal. Students often create big group chats — drama, fallouts, or arguments in these can quickly spiral.

Parent Strategy: Remind your child to pause before posting/sending anything. Encourage them to ask, "Would I be okay if a teacher/grandparent saw this?"

i If your child has Asthma or allergies, it is a requirement that they have a care plan. A care plan will be sent home to parents to complete and return back to school with their medication.

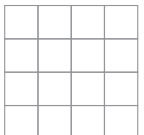
School must be informed if your child has any medical conditions and need to take medication.
