# ATHENS

Recently, a group of students from Mulberry Academy Shoreditch, Mulberry Woodside, and Mulberry School for Girls set off on an amazing trip to Athens, Greece — and what a few days it was!

The adventure started bright and early with a smooth flight that had everyone excited for what was ahead. Our first day in Athens included exploring the National Botanical Gardens and even spotting the Greek Parliament.

The next day was full of history and incredible views. We had a guided tour of the Parthenon, climbed to the top of the Acropolis, and saw the city from its highest point — a view you could see from everywhere in Athens! Afterwards, we wandered through Plaka, a charming area full of narrow streets, shops, and local food. Students loved trying new snacks and exploring the souvenir shops. We didn't stop there! Our historical walk continued through Monastiraki, the heart of old Athens, before the next day's highlight: an excursion to Delphi. Here, students learned about the Temple of Apollo and the famous Oracle — some even got to ask their own questions!


## RLACK Year 8 HISTURY Poetry MUNTHES Slam














## ear 8 and 9 in Wales



## **Year 9 Python coding**

Y9 GCSE Computer Science has made fast progress learning to code in Python. They have just started their first long project - designing and developing an adventure game!







Platforms like TikTok, YouTube and Instagram don't just show what you search for — they push content that keeps you hooked, which may include harmful or extreme material.

Year 7s can accidentally get drawn into "rabbit holes" of videos — from diet content to conspiracy theories without realising how it shapes their thinking.

Parent Strategy: Watch content together. Ask what they're seeing and how it makes them feel. Teach them to reset or manage recommendations (e.g. clearing watch history).
