Year 12 careers talk with Ipsos

On Thursday, we were really pleased to welcome Alice and Aaliyah from Ipsos, the global leaders in market research. They came in to talk to Year 12 students about Ipsos, a company which collects and analyses data on society, markets, and people to help organisations and government departments make informed decisions. Alice talked about the values of the organisation and the many opportunities available for employees to join clubs and sports teams, and volunteering in the community. She also explained the entry points into a career at Ipsos such as apprenticeship schemes, internships, placements and graduate programme.

Aaliyah gave valuable insight into her own experience of her first year at Ipsos on the degree apprenticeship programme, after leaving Sixth Form in 2025. She encouraged students by talking about having had rejections before being offered a fantastic opportunity at Ipsos and to never give up trying.

Year 12 students were then given the chance to ask questions about careers at Ipsos and they learned a lot about careers in the market research field.



TRAILFAM London to Gran Canaria

Over the last few weeks, the TrailFam race team has been running the full distance from London to Gran Canaria (3000km from London to Gran Canaria as a team). Every day, these young athletes put in the miles – through dark mornings, wind, rain, sleet – they haven't given up. They've shown determination and courage to earn a place on the start line at Transgrancanaria which will take place in March and they've raised a fantastic £7000!



MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

I choose three numbers from this number square, including one number from each row and one number from each column. I then multiply the three numbers together. What is the largest possible product?

1	2	3
4	5	6
7	8	9

ANSWER: 105

We consider the different possible choices from the top row. If 1 is chosen, then the options are 1, 5, 9 and 1, 6, 8 giving products 45 and 48 respectively. If 2 is chosen, the options are 2, 4, 9 and 2, 6, 7 giving products 72 and 84 respectively. Finally, if 3 is chosen, the options are 3, 4, 8 and 3, 5, 7 giving products 96 and 105. So 105 is the maximum.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD TO STAY SAFE ONLINE Understanding group chats

Many secondary-age students communicate mainly through group chats on apps such as Snapchat, Discord and Instagram, where large numbers of messages can be sent very quickly with little adult oversight.

- Ask your child which group chats they are part of and what they are used for (friends, gaming, schoolwork, social plans).
- Remind them that large group chats can change quickly and jokes can easily turn into unkind or harmful messages.
- Let your child know they can talk to you if a group chat starts to feel uncomfortable or unsafe.
