
Skiing with Year 7




JP Morgan Challenge

MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

Seventy pupils (37 boys and 33 girls) are divided into two groups, with forty pupils in Group I and thirty in Group II.

How many more boys are there in Group I than there are girls in Group II?

ANSWER: 7 more boys than girls

Let the number of boys in Group I be x . The number of girls in Group I is therefore $40 - x$ and the number of girls in Group II is $33 - (40 - x) = x - 7$.

There are therefore 7 girls fewer in Group II than there are boys in Group I.

Year 11 ceramic art

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD TO STAY SAFE ONLINE

Messages don't stay private

Although group chats can feel private, anything shared in them can be copied, screenshots or forwarded beyond the original group in seconds.

- Explain that messages, images and videos in group chats can be screenshots, forwarded or shared without permission.
- Remind your child that deleting a message does not mean it has disappeared.
- Encourage the rule: never send anything in a group chat that you wouldn't want shared more widely.
