Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing, in conjunction with my Headteacher colleagues, from local secondary schools across the borough to make you aware of a concerning social media post that is currently circulating locally. We are aware that there have been several similar posts circulating in neighbouring boroughs also. The anonymous post, which has been reported to the relevant social media companies, uses concerning language and imagery to promote violence between secondary school pupils, framing conflict as rivalry and encouraging young people to engage in physical confrontation. It also appears to encourage pupils to film and share incidents with the intention of humiliating others.

I can confirm that all local secondary headteachers are aware of the contents of this post and that the police, and the London Borough of Tower Hamlets have been informed. We understand that the relevant authorities are actively investigating the source of the post and monitoring online information closely.

We must stress how important it is for young people to understand that sharing, endorsing, or engaging with content that promotes violence causes real harm and can create a lasting digital record, with serious consequences both now and in the future.

We know that our young people want to come to school safely, learn, and be part of a positive community.

Maintaining a calm, safe, and peaceful environment for all families requires strong partnership between schools and parents, and we are grateful for your support in reinforcing clear expectations at home.

If you have concerns about your child or become aware of further online content that promotes harm, please contact the school's safeguarding team directly.

Thank you for your continued cooperation as we work together to keep our young people and communities safe.
