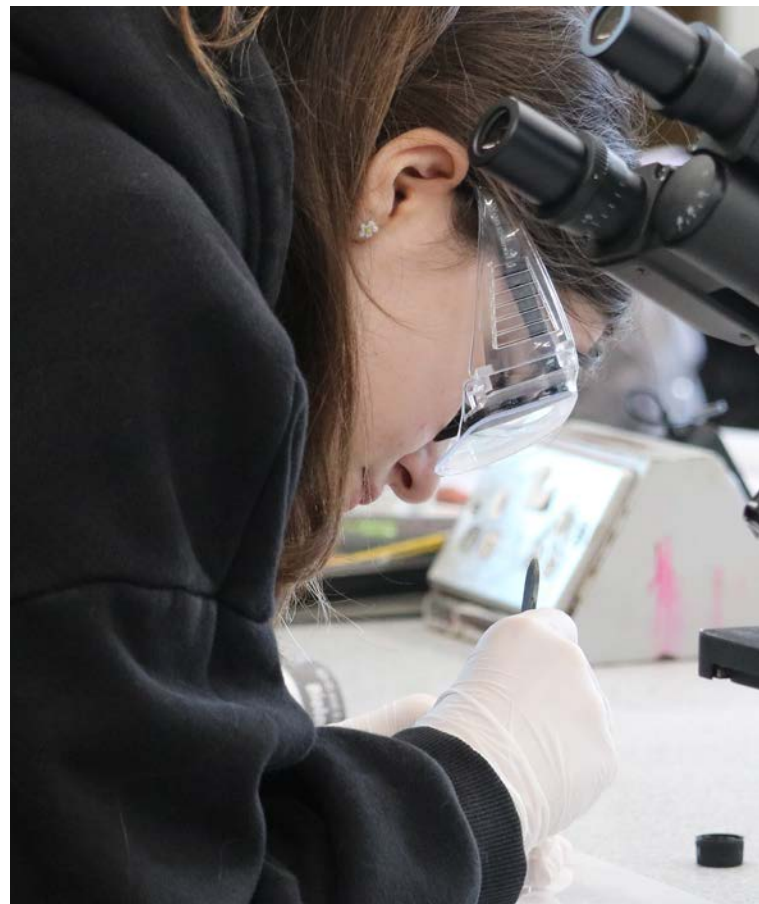

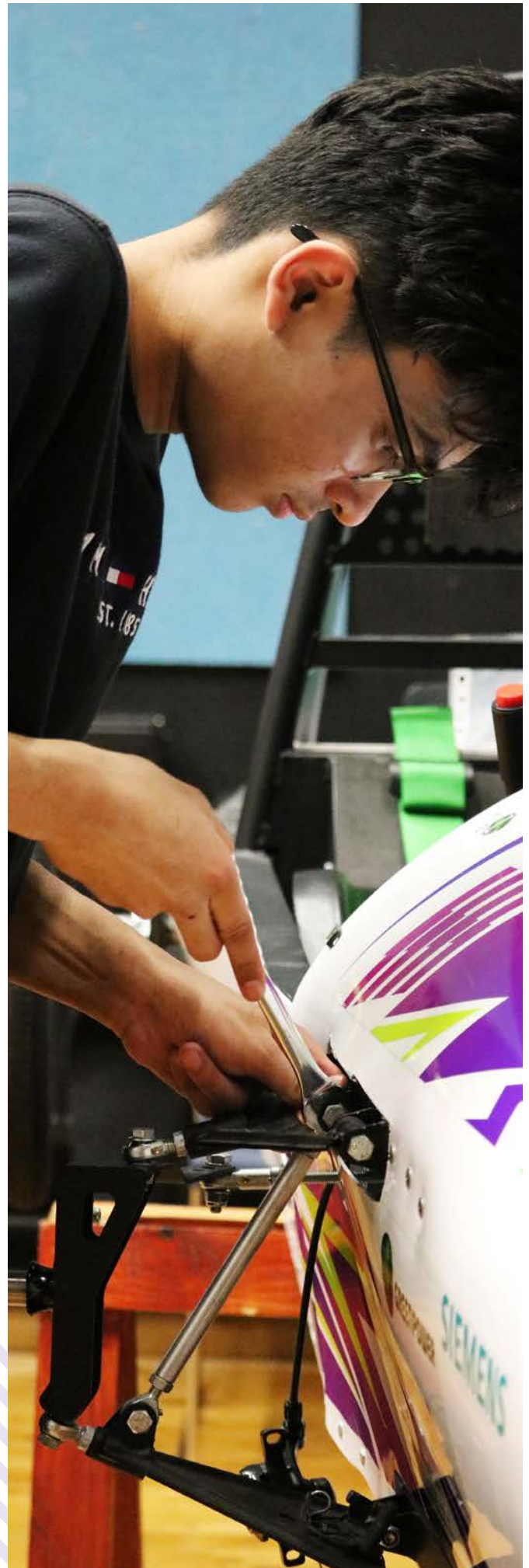

A Guide to the Routines and Procedures in our Sixth Form

As you embark on this exciting journey, we want to provide you with a comprehensive guide to the routines and procedures that will help you navigate your time here smoothly and successfully.

1. Regular attendance and punctuality are essential for academic success and personal development. Students are expected to arrive on time at 08:35am (A Level students) and 8.55am (Vocational students, for all classes and activities. If you are unable to attend due to illness or other circumstances, it is important to notify the Sixth Form office as soon as possible on 020 7920 7900.
2. Your timetable outlines your classes, tutorials, and any extracurricular activities or enrichment sessions you may have. Make sure to familiarise yourself with your timetable and keep it handy for reference.
3. As ambassadors of Mulberry Academy Shoreditch, Sixth Form students are expected to adhere to a smart and professional dress code. Details regarding the dress code will be provided to you upon enrolment.
4. In addition to scheduled classes, Sixth Form students are expected to dedicate time to independent study and coursework. Study periods are provided throughout the week for this purpose, and students are encouraged to use this time productively to work on assignments, research, and revision.
5. Teachers may assign homework and coursework to reinforce learning and develop independent study skills. Make sure to manage your time effectively and complete assignments by the specified deadlines.
6. We value your feedback and input. Your opinions and suggestions are important to us, and we encourage you to actively participate in evaluations, surveys, and student forums to help us continuously improve our Sixth Form experience.



Learners with SEN and Disability

We are committed to providing a supportive and inclusive learning environment for all students, including those with Special Educational Needs (SEN) or disabilities.

Here's how we support learners with SEN or disabilities:

1. We recognise that each student is unique, with their own strengths, challenges, and learning styles. To ensure that every student receives the support they need to succeed, we create individualised support plans in collaboration with the student, their parents/carers, and relevant professionals. These plans outline specific accommodations, interventions, and support strategies tailored to the student's needs.
2. We have a dedicated Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) who oversees the provision of support for students with SEN or disabilities. The SENCO works closely with teachers, support staff, and external agencies to coordinate support services and ensure that students' needs are effectively met.
3. We provide access to a range of specialist support services, including educational psychologists, speech and language therapists, occupational therapists, and specialist teachers. These professionals work collaboratively with the SENCO and teaching staff to assess students' needs, provide targeted interventions, and monitor progress.
4. Our teaching staff are trained in inclusive teaching and learning practices to ensure that lessons are accessible and engaging for all students. We employ a variety of teaching methods, instructional materials, and assessment strategies to accommodate diverse learning needs and preferences.
5. We regularly monitor students' progress and review their individualised support plans to ensure that they are making satisfactory progress and that their support needs are being met. We involve students, parents/carers, and relevant professionals in the review process to gather feedback and make any necessary adjustments to support strategies.
6. We provide transition support for students with SEN or disabilities as they move from Key Stage 4 to Sixth Form and from Sixth Form to post-school destinations, such as further education, employment, or independent living. This may include transition planning, preparation for exams and assessments, and guidance on post-school options.

Higher Education and CEIAG

Higher Education (HE) and Careers Education, Information, Advice, and Guidance (CEIAG) are integral components of our commitment to preparing students for life beyond Mulberry Academy Shoreditch Sixth Form.

For students considering Higher Education, we provide comprehensive support throughout the university application process. This includes guidance on choosing courses and universities, assistance with UCAS applications, writing personal statements, and preparing for admissions interviews and assessments. Visits to UCAS fairs, Higher Education exhibitions, and university open days expose students to a wide range of Higher Education options and institutions. These events provide students with the opportunity to speak directly with representatives from universities and gather information about courses, campuses, and student life.

Our CEIAG programme offers individualised support tailored to the specific needs and goals of each student. Whether aiming for traditional university pathways, apprenticeships, vocational training, or employment, students receive personalised advice and resources to help them achieve their ambitions. 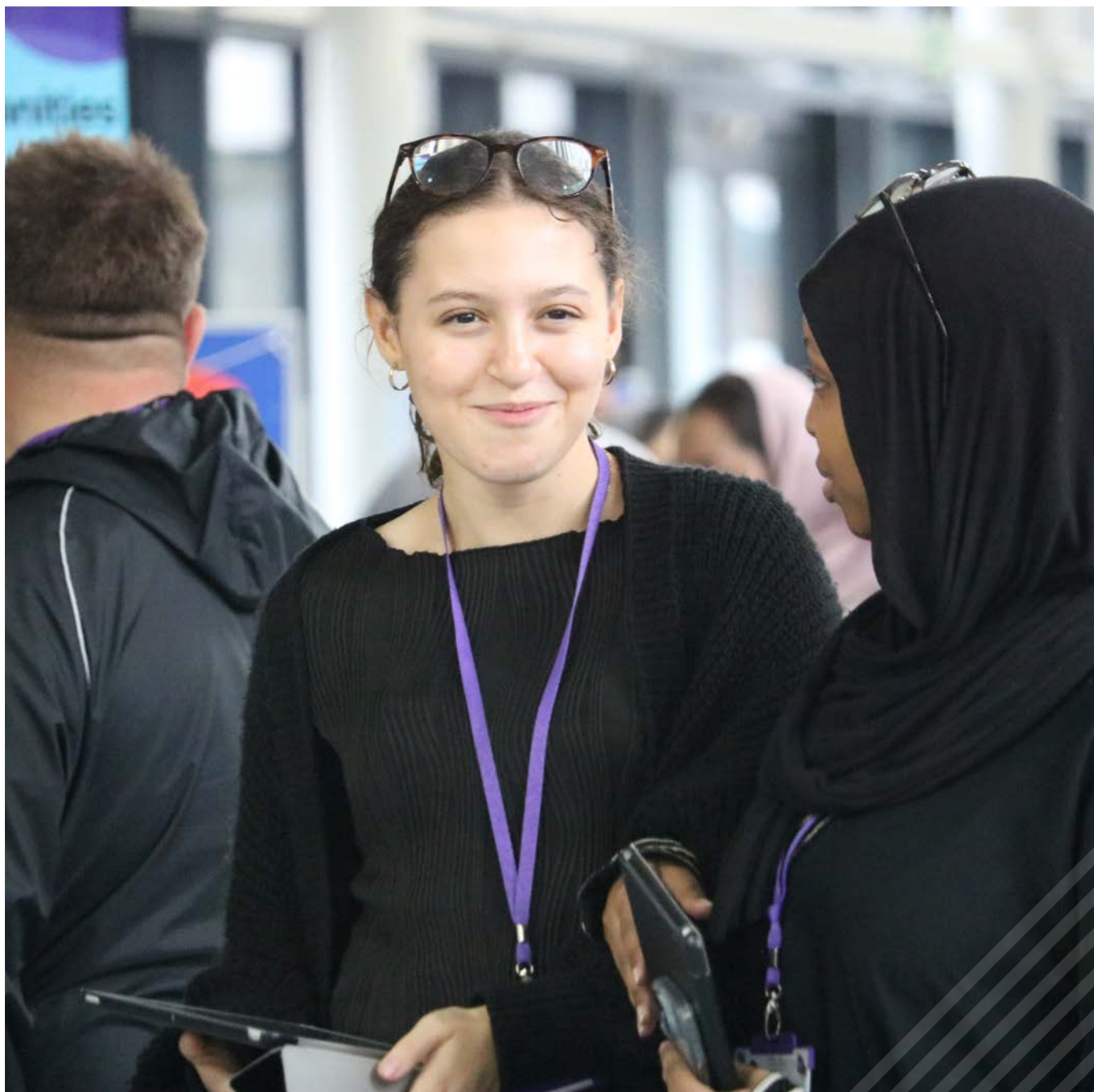

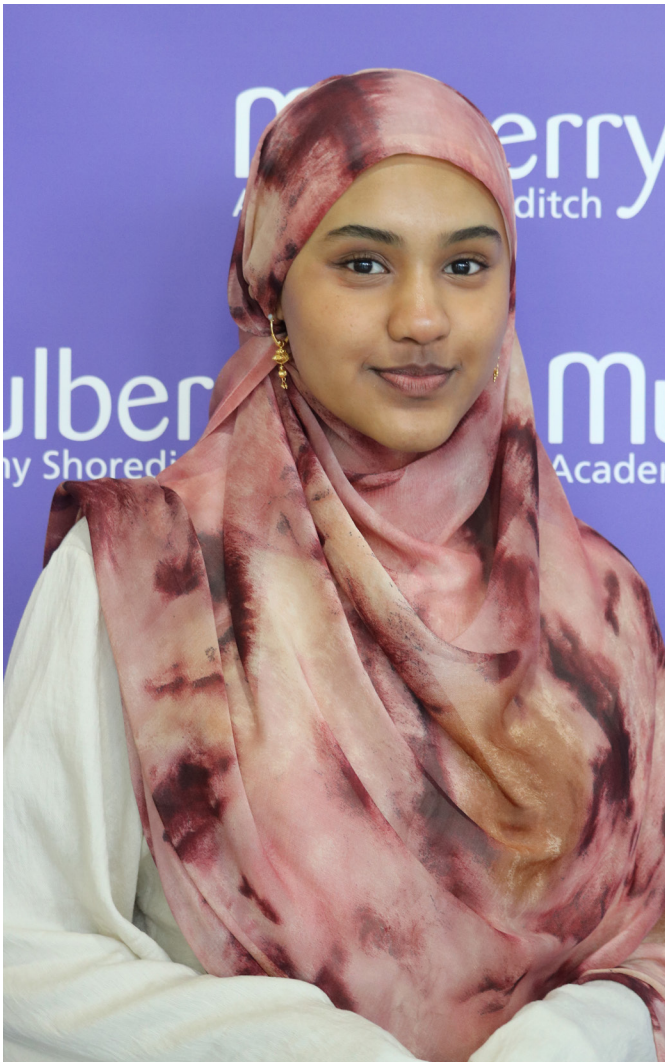
Our Success Stories
