We are delighted to share that five of our students have been awarded funding and support from the Mark Evison Foundation for an exciting and demanding expedition challenge this year.

Congratulations to Liam Bright, Tahir Humza Samed, Theo Coulthirst-Loftman, Hieu Nguyen and Anas Knaba in Year 12. The students will undertake a six day hiking and wild camping expedition in the Ben Nevis and Fort William area of Scotland. The challenge will test their resilience, teamwork, independence and determination as they navigate and camp in one of the UK's most dramatic landscapes.

The Mark Evison Foundation supports young people in creating and completing ambitious personal challenges outside of their comfort zones, helping to develop confidence, leadership and perseverance through real world experiences. Science Club

This week science club enjoyed methane bubbles. By bubbling methane into a special bubble mixture the flammable gas gets trapped, making the bubble flammable. Methane is lighter - than air because of this density difference, methane naturally rises meaning the students learnt how to safely set the floating bubbles alight. Please note: This experiment can not be done at home - only in a science lab.

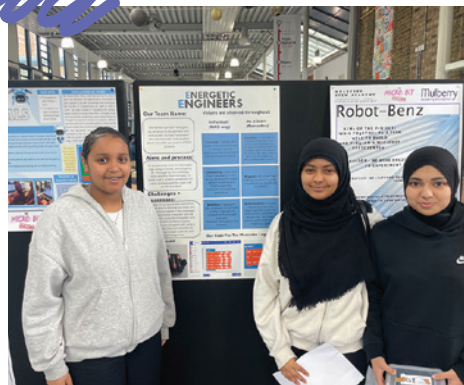
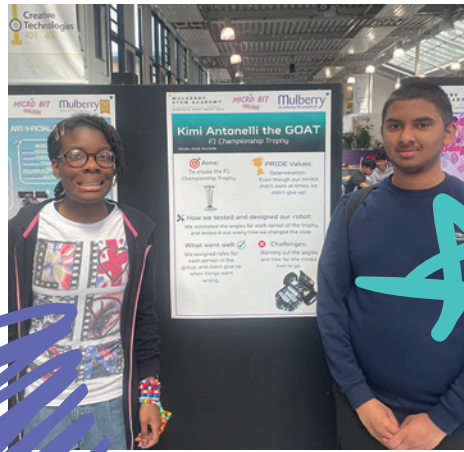

MATHS PROBLEM OF THE WEEK

Did you manage to solve the maths problem this week?

If $(a \times b = 2)$, $(b \times c = 24)$, $(c \times a = 3)$ and (a, b) and c are all positive, what is the value of $(a+b+c)$?

ANSWER: 10.5

From the three equations we see that $(abc)^2 = 2 \times 24 \times 3 = 144$ and so, since abc is positive, $abc = 12$. Then the third equation tells us that $a = \frac{1}{2}$, the second that $b = 4$ and the first that $c = 6$. Therefore $a + b + c = 10\frac{1}{2}$.



Deleting content does not always remove it

Even if a post or message is deleted, copies may already exist through screenshots or downloads. For example, an image sent privately can be saved and reshared without permission.

This can lead to ongoing issues even after a child tries to correct a mistake.

What parents can do: Reassure your child that mistakes can be managed, but emphasise the importance of thinking before sharing.
