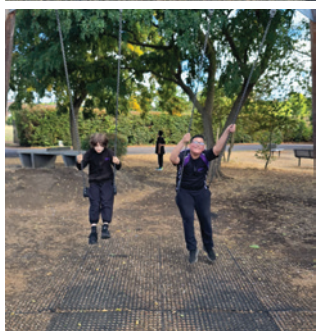
This is a fantastic achievement for our students, and we are extremely proud of them for getting involved, representing their community and taking on these important roles.
